

A Reflection for the Jubilee of Hope...

As we enter the Jubilee of Hope proclaimed by Pope Francis, we are invited to embark on a profound spiritual journey. This sacred year is a time to rediscover and live out the hope that comes from our faith in Christ. In a world often marked by uncertainty, division, and despair, the Jubilee of Hope reminds us that God's love never fails, and His promises endure forever.

Hope is at the very heart of our Christian identity. It is not a vague optimism or wishful thinking but a firm trust in God's presence and providence. This Jubilee invites us to open our hearts to that hope and to become its witnesses in a world that so desperately needs it.

With hearts full of trust and courage, may we live out this holy year as bearers of hope, proclaiming the Good News of God's love to all.





On Christmas Eve, the Holy Father, Pope Francis, opened the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome to begin the Jubilee Year of Hope, "Pilgrims of Hope."

Every 25 years, the Universal Church celebrates a Jubilee Year. Its celebration dates back to the Old Testament. During those Jubilee Years, debts would be forgiven, and prisoners and slaves were freed.

Now, Jubilees are celebrated as a time to re-establish a proper relationship with God, with one another and with all of Creation. Fr. Christopher J. Pujol and Fr. Eric J. Dinga, Co-directors of the Office of Worship, have been working to plan this once-in-aquarter-century event in the Diocese. Fr. Dinga said the Jubilee reminds us not of what is to come but what has already happened, which is the sanctifying grace for us needed to enter the kingdom of heaven.

"This already happened with the person of Christ coming to us on earth. He has left us with the tools needed, and the Jubilee reminds us to use those tools to join in His salvation and bring others along with us."




